#### Did You Know...

Have you ever wondered why the dock is painted different colors? Policy Letter 6 outlines the Dock Use Policy.

- 4. Use of the South 25 feet of the dock marked by a yellow painted stripe is reserved for dinghy sailors during daylight hours. Member sailing dinghies shall have priority over all member or non-member ocean boats in the yellow zone.
- 5. The south 60 feet of dock (including the yellow 25 foot zone) shall be marked with a red stripe. The 60 foot red zones may be used by Transient Ocean Boats and Authorized Guest Boats, but shall be available to all member boats on a priority basis over non-member boats. Members exercising this right shall courteously help affected non-member boats find space at guest mooring or space at the member's own mooring.

The city of Morro Bay has recently declared the be providing refreshments following: "No potable water may be used for cleaning so no one will go hungry or or rinsing docks, boats and other marine facilities, or driveways, patios, parking lots, sidewalks and other paved surfaces. Using hoses to wash cars is prohibited, but residents may use a bucket." Maintaining a boat and keeping it clean is important in keeping it not only looking good but also to keep various components from deteriorating. 


tried. So please, turn in your keys if you do not use them. We need them. Thanks.

### FROM YOUR REAR COMMODORE—Todd Hansen

The Race Results are on line, look to the club web page under Fleets. There is a page for the Bay fleet with information about several races this year so far and there is now an Ocean Fleet page as well now that they have results to report. Once you open the page you may need to use the tabs at the bottom of the page to navigate to the race you want to see.

The Bay Fleet successfully held the *Winter II* race on January 25<sup>th</sup>. In the first race this skipper benefitted when the leaders **Kevin Williams** and **Carlton Smith** engaged in a luffing

battle that allowed the third place boat to drop down on a more direct line and score a rare first. Another first in this race was **Greg Barker** joining the Bay Fleet in *Good Grief*, the boat he has chartered from **Joe Fram** while he is out in the Pacific. In the second race of the day the winds were very light and being mindful of the current was critical. After rounding E mark one had to sail over 90 degrees away from the finish line to get over to the sand spit and current relief. But it paid off in the end as it allowed this skipper to nip in and pass another who tried to sail straight up the channel. The adverse current and light winds were so dramatic by the end of the race that the final finisher was unable to complete the course in the allotted time after the first finisher. After watching the torture at the end of the second race the race committee called off the third race. Kudos to **Chris Surfleet** the PRO for the day for stepping up and practicing the Cal Poly Motto- Learn by Doing.

The Ocean Fleet was able to hold their first race of the New Year on February 9<sup>th</sup>. There was a good turnout with five crews ready for some adventure on the water. Unfortunately the wind was light most of the day and only two boats stuck it out to the bitter end – over five hours later. First to finish and overall winner in the lightest boat out there was **John Krossa** and his crew **Mark**. John and Mark had a little bit of trouble at the finish – they could not find the finish mark. Turns out it was obscured by a pair of tall ships engaged in a mock battle just outside the bay. Having cleared that their troubles were not over as they found themselves suddenly surrounded by bubbles and swirling smooth water. John and Mark are sure one the whales they had seen earlier was about to rise up underneath them and saw them in time to stop. Talk about an exciting finish to a race – cannon fire and whales!

And finally this report from Cal Poly Sailing Team Co-Captain Katie Cornella regarding their most recent race hosted by Stanford University in Redwood City: We had a competitive regatta with teams from all over California, which was a great learning experience for our racing team. We were able to get many of our newer team members and under classmen out on the water to experience competitive collegiate racing with 17 teams on the water. Teams rotated between 420's and FJ's. We had a great winter day in Redwood City with clouds, rain and a shifty South wind. Ten total races were sailed in winds that ranged from 3 to 15 knots in the highest gusts. It was great practice for our upcoming qualifying regattas Newport South 3 & 4 this next weekend.



#### What's in Wine Labels? - A Lot





In my last Note 10, I discussed the information contained in the wine varietal or name. This note will consider the information in the rest of the label. As detailed in the two examples here, the basic information is the variety, appellation (one of over 200 officially designated appellations, known as American Viticultural Areas, AVAs) and the vintage which is the year picked.

All bottles of United States wine must be marked with a brand name, wine type, alcohol content, bottle volume. sulfite content, and the producer's name and address. Wine types are "table wine", "dessert wine" and "sparkling wine." Table wine is defined as grape wine with an alcoholic content less than 14% and is taxed less, 21¢ per 750ml bottle, than wines with more than 14% alcohol, 31¢. In Europe, the term 'Table Wine' has nothing to do with alcohol strength, and has traditionally denoted wines of basic quality. AVA and varietal information can substitute for wine type. For an AVA title to appear on a wine label, at least 85% of the grapes must have been grown within the boundaries of that AVA. Note that designations such as "Reserve" and "Estate Bottled" have no particular meanings and are at the discretion and definition of the producer.


Additional information is sometimes provided on wine labels. Some is more descriptive of the wine, e.g., J Lohr Gesture series, and gives information usually found only on that wine's data sheet, see my Note 7. Labels can also provide historical information such as L'affaire Châteauneuf-du-Pape, which is depicted by vintner Randall Grahm on his Le Cigar Volant label. In 1954, UFO sightings and alien abductions in rural France so concerned local citizens over their effect on wine that the mayor banned all UFOs from landing in vineyards. Similarly, shown on Red Zeppelin's vintner Stillman Brown's Colossus label is Morro Bay's Grecian Period, when the Colossus of Rhodes (and an anachronism Zeppelin) stood at the harbor entrance. Finally, vintner David


