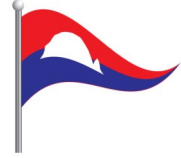

Races Gone By: The 2016 racing season started on the first of the year with the Hangover Regatta hosted by the MBYC Juniors. Marina and Charlotte Graves worked the flags and signals while Antonio Silva

helped out in the safety boat. And what a safety boat it was. Brooks and Michael Measures splashed their Ranger 21 Tug in Morro Bay for a blessing and inaugural safety boat service. The fleet of 9 Daysailers and one Lido14 began racing in light wind at 11:00. Tidal flow was minimal the entire day. The first race went to Terry Paris and Dan McDonald in "Rebel Banana" with a second by Kevin Williams and Tim Volpe in

"Protest". The second race went to "Protest" with "Rebel Banana" falling back to 9th. This result cost "Rebel Banana" a chance at the trophy, for although Terry came back to win race number three, Kevin's second place in the last race put him first overall with 5 points, second was Tom and Cindy Fee in "Ferocious" with 9 points, and Terry and Dan taking third with 11 points.



The next race of the year and the first Ocean Fleet race set off on January tenth. Four boats, Lynn Meissen's "Guayacan", Werner Weinstock's "Pangea", Tony Gomez's "High 5", and Rich Steuk's "Synergy" started in light but pleasant conditions. First back on the dock was "Guayacan" after abandoning for lack of wind. The rest of the fleet went on to finish with "High 5"

overcoming its negative PHRF rating to correct out two hours ahead of "Synergy" followed by "Pangea". The next ocean race is scheduled for February 21st.

Winter II, PRO'd by Stanley Craig, was run with ten boats on January 16th. The first race in the series was sailed by five boats in rainy conditions back in December. For Winter II the weather was fair and winds were light, coming more from the West than usual. The first race was a series of loops around C, E, and 14 which and was shortened after two laps. Carlton Smith in "Beach Party" took first followed by Justin Bradshaw in his new (to him) boat "Amorcita" and then Keiran Hansen in "Indrath". The next two races had more wind and the courses reached up to the A mark. The extra West in the wind made spinnaker work risky and several boats lost places setting and dousing. Race number two had the same first three finishers, but with "Indrath" in first followed by "Amorcita" and "Beach Party". "Indrath" and "Amorcita" went 1,2 again in the third race with Bob Walker and Simon Graves in "Deja Vu" taking third. Keiran Hansen and "Indrath" took first with 4 points followed by Justin Bradshaw in "Amorcita" with 7 points and "Beach Parth" with 10 points. At this point in the series Carlton Smith in "Beach Party" leads by 9 points.

Upcoming Races in February: Bay Fleet Winter III will be PRO'd by Bob Schwenoha and team "Happy Trails" on February 13. This is also the day of the first race in the Lopez cup series put on by the San Luis YC. The Ocean Fleet races Winter II on February 22nd.

They Used To Call Them Tidal Waves - In 1960, a tsunami surge suddenly tilted Ken Jenkins' docked sailboat. He sent his family to high ground and quickly drove the boat to the deepest hole in the Morro Bay harbor to ride out the hours of surging water. The County Harbor Master and MBYC charter member knew that the best place for the boat was at sea or over a deep channel. A massive outflow of water that announces a tsunami will leave boats tipped over and mangled together, and when the water returns, big problems ensue. His daughter, Kathy Haynie, who had just turned six years old, shared these memories in her blog in 2011. She had experienced the tsunami caused by the largest known earthquake, the 9.5 Magnitude Chile Earthquake on May 22, 1960.

Luckily, there was little damage in Morro Bay and the MBYC houseboat fared well. That houseboat, bought in 1959 for \$500, was the club's first "location" and had been moored in various places along the water front. It was once pulled out to the sandspit! When placed near the fuel docks and marina, it was easy to host visiting sailors, but those growing businesses eventually asked that the houseboat be moved.

In 1964, the club enjoyed being at the south Embarcadero boat ramp with ample room for races and larger gatherings. Barney Pikes, our first commodore, jury-rigged a wet bar and covered the front of it with padding, Naugahyde and upholstery tacks. He learned the hard way that he should have taken his tools home that night.

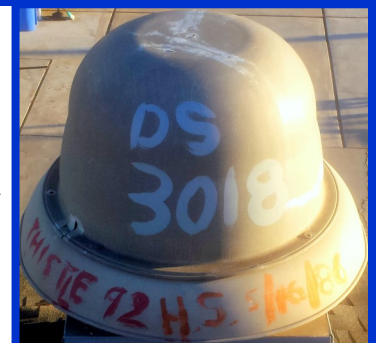
On March 27, 1964, at 5:36 p.m., the 9.2 Magnitude Great Alaskan Earthquake struck, now known as the second largest earthquake since 1900. The Central Coast was alerted by 11:50 p.m. of the potential of a tsunami of unknown proportions. Evacuations began and Ken Jenkins, Harbor Master, called boat owners to quickly put their boats to sea. The first big surge hit at 1:30 a.m. with the water level rising ten feet in ten minutes. The brand new Harbor boat was the first to break loose and sink. The fuel dock broke away but was lassoed from out of the channel. Four pleasure craft sank. Surges continued for hours while forty large fishing boats chugged away in the middle of the channel, enduring intense four foot changes every twenty to forty minutes. The houseboat broke away from its moorings in the first surges. The SLO County Telegram-Tribune reported:

"Alert Response Holds Damage From Tidal Wave To Minimum" *A severe loss was incurred by the Morro Bay Yacht Club which lost its houseboat. The boat, moored near the south Embarcadero boat launching ramp, broke loose along with walkways and floats. It sailed down the bay on one of the 20-mile-an-hour outgoing surges and rammed into the end of the Carver T pier, splintering the houseboat completely. (March 30, 1964) "*

It exploded upon impact and quickly sank. Later on, a diver looked for salvage, such as trophies, but only the hammer that Barney Pikes had left on board was recovered. The door jamb and railroad door lock were eventually found near Hazard Canyon. The Morro Bay Yacht Club's first clubhouse and only houseboat was no more.

All should be aware that the Coast Guard Morro Bay has authority to prohibit any craft regardless of size from crossing the harbor entrance bar when they declare it hazardous. This authority is effective through February 28 unless renewed. The regulation applies to the area from No 2 buoy to inside the harbor to No 6. The regulation is posted at the Transient sign in area.

The Mess that is the Storage Yard - A gentle reminder that rain encourages growth of trees and flowers, and weeds especially under those boats that do not move for long periods. Those boats which are sailed get and deserve the more convenient spots; those unused will be moved to the back. Flat tires are a really good indication that the boat is not used. Nothing may be stored BESIDE your boat which increases the footprint; on or under is okay.
