A bit of Groundhog Day to start; still working on getting the stairs and chair lift project started as well as the deck pile casing project begun. 
# **REAR COMMODORE—Dave Hensinger**



Maybe it Never Happened-Bay Fleet The last race in a busy Bay Fleet May schedule was run by Steve Borges with assistance from Katy Crawford, Steve Nukes, Dot Rygh, Chuck Losness, and others. Spring III was run in light to moderate and occasionally shifty winds which were a pleasant change from the strong gusts earlier in the week. The final bay fleet race of the spring series was contested by seven boats: Patrick Gorey and Scott Turpin in Super Weiner, Simon Graves and Bob Walker in Deja Vu, Terry Paris and Dan McDonald in Rebel Banana, Carlton Smith, and Deborah Paes de Barros in Beach Party, David Hensinger and John Clements in Zopilote, Rich Leamon and Bill Albrecht in Snap, and Chris Surfleet and Daniel Goldsmith in Solar Coaster. With the exception of first place the racing was very close.

The first race went to *Beach Party* followed by *Super Weiner* and *Deja Vu*. The second race took the fleet up around A and featured some very shifty winds. Going to the first windward mark *Beach Party* missed out on a huge lift that put *Deja Vu* on his tail. After rounding the two leaders headed to sand spit only to fall into a hole. Carlton got out in time, but *Deja Vu* was not so lucky. The second race finished *Beach Party*, *Zopilote*, *Super Weiner*, *déjà vu*.

After the first two races Beach Party was in first place with 2 points, Super Weiner was in second with 5 points, and Deja Vu and Zopilote were tied for third with seven points. The last race was three laps around C, E and 14. There was little tide, and the wind was largely from the west and fairly light. Carlton was over early but quickly recovered and took the lead. There were several lead changes as neither the longer faster sail along the spit or the shorter slower sail directly from E to 14 were consistently faster. The final race finished Beach Party, Rebel Banana, Solar Coaster, Zopilote, Deja Vu, Super Weiner, Snap. This resulted in a 3 way tie for second. Final results Beach Party, Super Weiner, Rebel Banana.

The Spring Series champion was Carlton Smith with 9 points over 9 races.

Ocean Fleet-From Ken Muther, Ocean Fleet Captain: The Ocean Fleet finished the Spring Series of three races on May 15<sup>th</sup>. In the first race (April 3<sup>rd</sup>) there wasn't much wind for the first half of the race. Kisskidee led most of the way but was passed on the final leg by Pangaea (the winner) and Synergy. Seven boats entered and all finished.

The second and third races were heavy-weather events with the wind reaching 28 knots. Three boats entered the second race and two finished. Savage Lady was the winner with Evening Tide second. Pangaea retired with a torn sail.

The last race was the longest at 12.4 miles. Six entered and three finished. Whizbang was first with Pangaea and Evening Tide not too far behind. Altogether 10 boats took part in the Spring Series. Pangaea won the series with 7 points, Evening Tide was second with 11 points and Savage Lady was third with 17 points. Other boats in the series were Whizbang, Synergy, Kisskidee, Fiorghra, Jessie Marie, Rejoice and Guayacan.

The "Two Sticker" was postponed due to too many ketches and schooners on the injured reserve list.
